Do you know your capital credit balance with Carbon Power & Light, Inc.? Every year we allocate your share of our margins back to you, our Member-Owners. The allocation for the previous year is displayed in the message location of your April bill. This is the bill for your March usage that is presented the first part of April.

When you receive a retirement check, the check stub also has your balance information included. If you are a member that keeps this documentation, you may have noticed that the beginning balance on the check stub does not match the ending balance from the previous year's retirement check stub. The allocation amount from the April bill is the difference. To reconcile your check stub, you take the ending balance from the previous year's

retirement check stub, add in the April allocation, and you have the beginning balance from the current retirement check stub.

When the retirement checks were sent in June of 2020 the DirecTV portion of your capital credit balance was omitted on the check stub. So if you complete the reconciliation steps discussed above, the ending balance will be short your DirecTV allocation. This was simply an error in checking that the DirecTV allocations were included in the check run report.

Energy Efficiency Tip of the Month

Use wool or rubber dryer balls in the clothes dryer to reduce drying time and static.

Wool dryer balls can also absorb extra moisture. These are an efficient alternative to dryer sheets, which can create buildup on the dryer's filter and reduce air circulation. If you prefer dryer sheets, scrub the filter once a month to remove buildup.
