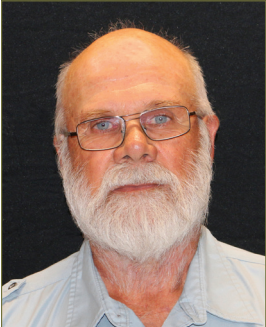

We have discovered Member-Owners that have added solar or wind under the net metering law that have not contacted Carbon to complete the agreement and make sure the installation complies with the Wyoming law.

Every Carbon Member wishing to add a net metered generation source must complete an agreement with Carbon. Failure to complete the agreement puts your electric service at risk of disconnection for safety violation.

Member's that are interested in owning their own generation resource are responsible for the design, installation, operation, and maintenance of the system. We assist with meeting state and company requirements and help you submit your Interconnection Agreement.

From you we will need the signed interconnection agreement containing a description of the equipment you will have interconnected as well as PDF documentation

for that equipment.

You will need to go through the plan review process with the State of Wyoming. Once your generating facilities have been installed the state electrical inspector will need to inspect your installation. After the installation passes inspection a copy of the report stating such will need to be provided to Carbon.

Once we have the plan set, signed agreement, and report from the state indicating the installation has passed inspection, we will install a net meter and then you may begin generating electricity.

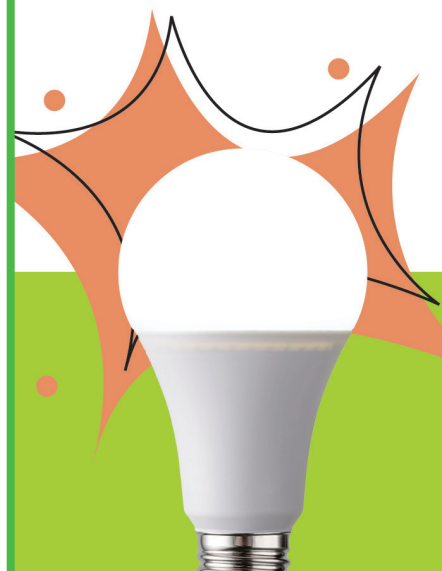
ENERGY EFFICIENCY

TIP OF THE MONTH

Did you know ceiling fans can help you save energy? Ceiling fans create a windchill effect on your skin to make you feel a few degrees cooler. Raise the thermostat a few degrees and turn on fans to reduce air conditioning costs.

Set fan blades to rotate counterclockwise during summer months and clockwise during winter months. Remember, ceiling fans cool people but don't actually lower the indoor temperature. Turn them off when you leave the room.

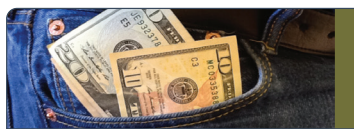
